Chapter 6 — Unfinished Prophets: Elijah, Jonah, and John the Baptizer

Elijah: Stuck in Spectacle

1. If Elijah was an "unfinished prophet," what did he need in order to be "finished?"

1. Rohr says that sadness and tears are a divine evolution of anger. How do you understand that?

Collective Sadness – and Redemption

- 3. Rohr says "The body of Christ is one great and shared sadness and one continuous joy, and we are saved just by remaining connected to it." How do we do that?

- 2. Rohr says grief does not have to be passive, but can be a necessary stage of entering stage of "going into," on the way to "going through," and then coming "back home." Does that ring true in your experience?
